Note 1	<i>Permission required from POMC to wash & gas free at Port Phillip Bay outer anchorage.</i>
Note 2	<i>Marpol wash where applicable is exempt from the above requirements.</i>
Note 3	<i>Where practicable, portable tank cleaning machines must be in position prior to arrival.</i>
Note 4	<i>All tank washings must be declared with a brief procedure and approximate quantity prior to arrival and in the ship shore safety check list.</i>
Note 5	<i>When washing tanks; adjacent tanks must:</i> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - <i>Be inert or gas free</i> - <i>Be empty or contain non hazardous cargo</i> - <i>Not contain Table 1 products</i>
