The Port Capacity Enhancement Program (PCEP) aims to expand capacity and enhance facilities at Port of Melbourne.

The project would be a milestone in the history of Port of Melbourne. It includes the new Webb Dock North Container Terminal and would secure the long-term future for the Tasmanian trade at Victoria Dock.

Driving economic growth and keeping goods moving, PCEP is projected to support 3,500¹ jobs per year, and would result in a boost of approximately \$5.7 billion² to the Victorian economy.
