

General Privacy Collection Statement of Port of Melbourne

Port of Melbourne ('we', 'us') collects your personal information from you and at times from third parties to:

- permit you to access our IT systems or a site managed by us
- respond to and investigate your enquiry/feedback/complaint
- process your job application and obtain references and police checks
- contact you about and administer our events, workshops and seminars we think may be of interest to you
- contact you about business development opportunities and Port projects that we think may be of interest to you
- manage a competition you may have entered and announce the winners
- communicate with the community, government and other stakeholders about Port activities
- respond to and investigate incidents that have occurred in the Port precinct
- manage and ensure personal and transport safety at the Port and its precincts
- maintain, construct and/or remediate land and marine port infrastructure
- comply with our legal obligations and reporting requirements.

You do not have to provide all the information requested but if you do not, this may affect the type and quality of service or response that Port of Melbourne can provide you. If you provide any personal information that is sensitive information about you such as your health information, you agree to Port of Melbourne collecting that information and using it for the purposes described.

- to Commonwealth and Victorian government departments, agencies and regulators
- as required or permitted by law.
