

Road update: Swanson Dock Precinct

Port Rail Transformation Project

Coode Road Closure/Intermodal Way Opening

As part of the Port Rail Transformation Project (P RTP), the Port of Melbourne will be permanently closing a section of Coode Road between Dock Link Road and Phillips Road.

A new east-west connection, Intermodal Way will be open to traffic. **Access to all terminals will remain open throughout this changeover period.**

Up to 30 March 2023 (subject to weather conditions):

- There will be no Dock Link Road north bound lanes connecting to Footscray Road.
- Access to Footscray Road is to be via Coode Road and Appleton Dock Road
- Coode Road will remain open to both east bound and west bound traffic during this time.

Between 31 March and 3 April 2023 (subject to weather conditions):

- There will be no entry to the port at Dock Link Road, south bound Dock Link Road lanes will be closed. Use Footscray Road east bound lanes and enter the port at Appleton Dock Road.
- Coode Road will remain open to both east bound and west bound traffic during this time.
- During this time traffic will be able to exit the port at Dock Link Road with a left turn at Footscray Road.



From the evening of 3 April 2023 (subject to weather conditions)

- Intermodal Way will be open to both east and west bound traffic.
- Coode Road, between Dock Link Road and Phillips Road will be permanently closed.



Exact dates may change due to inclement weather and other issues.

It is also noted that the West Gate Tunnel Project will be closing the west bound carriageway of Footscray Road from the 29 March 2023 and reopening the east bound carriageway at this time. Details can be found at www.bigbuild.vic.gov.au/disruptions
